

VENICE is a late-flowering white mustard variety recommended by the CSAR, with beet cyst nematode resistance BCA 2 (70-90% nematode reduction). It also has good lodging resistance and is characterized by very rapid ground cover.

Under favorable growing conditions, the crop can produce a significant amount of organic matter in a short time. White mustard then forms a tall (1 to 1.5 meters) and dense crop. Pre-treatment (such as chopping or mowing) is usually required to effectively incorporate the crop into the soil. White mustard is highly susceptible to clubroot, making it less suitable for a crop rotation plan that includes cabbage crops.
